Through reading aloud, a child:

- Bonds with their parent.
- Builds vocabulary.
- Begins to understand that stories have a beginning, a middle, and an end.
- Boosts brain development.
- Encourages curiosity and imagination.
- Learns reading fundamentals like how to read from left to right and how to turn pages.
- Identifies reading as a pleasurable activity.
- Improves test scores in school.


